HARPREET KAUR JEEWAN, J. (ORAL)

[1] The present petition has been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. for quashing of FIR No. 17, dated 06.02.2020, registered at Police Station Jandiala, Tehsil and District Amritsar (Amritsar Rural), under Sections 406 and 498-A of the IPC, on the basis of compromise deed dated 26.04.2024 (Annexure P-2) executed between the parties.

[2] Learned counsel for the petitioners *inter alia* contends that the FIR was registered at the instance of respondent No. 2-complainant who is the wife of petitioner No. 1-Jagmeet Singh. A compromise deed dated 26.04.2024 (Annexure P-2) has been executed between the parties. As per the compromise, now both the parties have amicably settled their dispute.

Petitioner No. 1-husband and respondent No. 2-wife are residing together.



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Respondent No. 2 does not want to take any action against the present petitioners.

[3] On 07.05.2024, learned counsel appearing on behalf of respondent No. 2 had confirmed the factum of compromise between the parties.

[4] On 07.05.2024, the parties were directed to appear before the trial Court/Illaq Magistrate for recording of their statements regarding the compromise.

[5] As per the report dated 22.07.2024, received from the learned Judicial Magistrate First Class, Amritsar, the compromise effected between the parties is genuine, voluntary and without any coercion or undue influence. The petitioners have not been declared as “Proclaimed Offender”.

[6] Learned State counsel has not raised any objection regarding the acceptance of the present petition.

[7] The matrimonial dispute between the parties stands settled. Keeping in view the fact that the compromise between the parties is genuine and voluntarily made and in view of the ratio of the decision of the Hon’ble Apex Court in *Gian Singh Versus State of Punjab (SC) 2012 (4) RCR (Criminal) 543* and the decision of the Hon’ble Full Bench of this Court in *Kulwinder Singh and others vs. State of Punjab and others 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052*, the ends of justice would meet if the FIR and consequential proceedings are quashed by accepting the compromise between the parties.

[8] Consequently, this petition is allowed and FIR No. 17, dated

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06.02.2020, registered at Police Station Jandiala, Tehsil and District Amritsar (Amritsar Rural), under Sections 406 and 498-A of the IPC, and all the subsequent proceedings emanating therefrom are ordered to be quashed, qua the petitioners.

[9] However, respondent No.2 and the State shall be at liberty to seek cancellation of this order, in case the final terms and conditions of compromise dated 26.04.2024 are violated.

[10] Pending miscellaneous application(s), if any, shall also stand disposed of.
