SANJIV BERRY, J. (ORAL)

1. By way of present petition filed under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973, petitioner seeks quashing of DDR (Annexure P-1) registered in FIR No.80 dated 17.03.2023 (Annexure P-2) under Sections 323, 324 and 34 of IPC (Sections 325 and 326 of IPC added later on) at Police Station B. Division, Amritsar City and all consequential proceedings arising therefrom on the basis of compromise dated 30.04.2024 (Annexure P-3) executed between the parties. Details of the DDR (Annexure P-1) are as follows:

2. With the intervention of respectables and elderly people of the society, the parties have arrived at a settlement vide compromise deed dated 30.04.2024 (Annexure P-2), which is duly signed by them. The matter was referred to the Court below for recording of statements of the parties and to report with respect to genuineness of the compromise arrived at between the parties. Judicial Magistrate 1st Class, Amritsar, vide report dated 06.07.2024, has apprised this Court that the compromise arrived at between the parties is genuine and without any pressure. The petitioner has also deposited cost of Rs.10,000/- in compliance of order dated 13.05.2024.

3. Respondent No. 2 is represented by his counsel and does not oppose the compromise.

4. In view of the report of the Judicial Magistrate 1st Class, Amritsar, and in view of the decision of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **"Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab and another", 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543** and **"Narinder Singh and Others Vs. State of Punjab and Another", (2014) 6 SCC 466**, this Court is of the opinion that no useful purpose can be served by keeping with the criminal proceedings pending, since the complainant has himself compromised the dispute with the petitioner/accused person.

5. In the circumstances, the present petition is allowed. DDR No.02 dated 26.03.2023 under Sections 323 and 324 of IPC registered at Police Station B Division, Amritsar City (Annexure P-1) registered in FIR No.80 dated 17.03.2023 (Annexure P-2) under Sections 323, 324 and 34 of IPC (Sections 325 and 326 of IPC added later on) at Police Station B.
