Present petition has been filed under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of bail pending trial to the petitioner in FIR No.0264 dated 28.11.2023 (P-1) under Sections 25(8) of the Arms Act, 1959, registered at Police Station Maqboolpura, Police Commissionerate Amritsar.

2. Custody certificate of the petitioner dated 21.05.2024 has been produced by learned State counsel today in Court. The same is taken on record.

3. Contends that health condition of the petitioner is deteriorating day by day as he is suffering from psychiatric disorder; hence, be granted bail pending trial.

4. Learned State counsel while opposing the prayer submits that apart from the present case, petitioner is facing three other cases and in case released on bail, he shall hamper the trial.



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5. Heard learned counsel for the parties and perused the paper book.
6. Concededly, petitioner has already been charge-sheeted in the present case and minimum sentence prescribed under Section 25(8) of the Arms Act, 1959, is 10 years. Apart that, petitioner is facing three cases of serious nature, details of which are as under:-

7. As result of the above, there is every likelihood that in case petitioner is released on bail at this stage, he may tamper the trial.
8. In view of the above, there is no option, except to dismiss the petition.
9. Ordered accordingly.
10. Pending application(s), if any, shall also stand disposed off.
