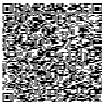

1. The present petition has been filed under Section 482 of Code of Criminal Procedure for quashing of FIR No.150 dated 22.09.2021 registered under Section 406 of IPC and Section 13 of the Punjab Travel Professionals (Regulation) Act, 2014 at Police Station Sadar Jalandhar and all the subsequent proceedings arising therefrom, on the basis of compromise dated 04.10.2023 (Annexure P-2).

2. This Court vide orders dated 17.05.2024 and thereafter vide order dated 14.10.2024 had directed the parties to appear before the trial Court to get their statements recorded and the learned Magistrate was directed to send its report qua the genuineness of the compromise.

3. Pursuant to the aforesaid orders, parties have appeared before the Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate, Jalandhar and got their statements recorded. On the basis of the statements so recorded, learned Judge has submitted a copy of report dated 21.11.2024 to the effect that the compromise



has been effected between the parties voluntarily and without any coercion or undue influence.

4. At this stage, learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI-Vipan Kumar, who is present in the Court has submitted that the petitioner has expired on 24.11.2024.

5. Learned counsel for the petitioner has also sought instructions and verified this fact.

6. In view of above, the present petition is disposed of as having been rendered infructuous.
