[1] The present petition has been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. for quashing of FIR No.066 dated 05.07.2023 registered at Women Police Station, Narnaul, District Mahendergarh under Sections 323, 34, 406, 498-A, 506 IPC, on the basis of compromise deed dated 26.06.2024 (Annexure P-8) executed between the parties; copy of the affidavit filed on behalf of the respondent No.2 (Annexure P-2) and joint first statement recorded in a petition under Section 13-B of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 (Annexure P-3).

[2] Learned counsel for the petitioners contends that the FIR was registered due to a matrimonial dispute between the parties and now the parties have executed a compromise deed dated 26.06.2024 (Annexure P-8).

He further contends that both the petitioner No.1-husband and respondent No.2-wife have already filed a joint petition for divorce under Section 13-B of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 before the Family Court, Bulandshehar. As the matter stands settled between the parties, as such respondent No.2 does not want to take any action in the present FIR.

[3] Learned counsel appearing on behalf of respondent No. 2 has confirmed the factum of compromise between the parties.

[4] On 18.07.2024, the parties were directed to appear before the trial Court/Illaq Magistrate for recording of their statements regarding the compromise.

[5] As per the report dated 27.08.2024, received from the learned Judicial Magistrate First Class, Narnaul, the compromise effected between the parties is genuine, voluntary and without any coercion or undue influence. The petitioners have not been declared as "Proclaimed Offender".

[6] Learned State counsel has not raised any objection regarding the acceptance of the present petition.

[7] The matrimonial dispute between the parties stands settled. Keeping in view the fact that the compromise between the parties is genuine and voluntarily made and in view of the ratio of the decision of Hon'ble Apex Court in **Gian Singh Versus State of Punjab (SC) 2012 (4) RCR (Criminal) 543** and the decision of Hon'ble the Full Bench of this Court in **Kulwinder Singh and others vs. State of Punjab and others 2007 (3) RCR (Criminal) 1052**, the ends of justice would meet if the FIR and consequential proceedings are quashed by accepting the compromise

between the parties.

[8] Consequently, this petition is allowed and FIR No. 066 dated 05.07.2023 registered at Women Police Station, Narnaul, District Mahendergarh under Sections 323, 34, 406, 498-A, 506 IPC, and all the subsequent proceedings emanating therefrom are ordered to be quashed, qua the petitioners.

[9] However, respondent No.2 and the State shall be at liberty to seek cancellation of this order, in case the final terms and conditions of compromise are violated.

[10] Pending miscellaneous application(s), if any, shall also stand disposed of.
