1. This is a civil writ petition filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ in the nature of certiorari to quash the premature retirement order dated 11.03.2024 (Annexure P-2).
2. On 22.05.2024, this Court was pleased to pass the following order:-
