VIKAS BAHL, J. (ORAL)

1. Present writ petition has been filed under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India for issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus directing the respondent Nos.1, 2 and 4 to allow the petitioner to appear in the Fourth Semester Examination of B.Ed (Two Year Course).

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that as far as the main prayer of the petitioner is concerned, the same has been rendered infructuous, but certain documents i.e., DMC of BSc. 1st Semester, DMC of 3rd & 4th Semester of B.Ed and Degree of B.Ed., are with the

respondent Nos.1 and 2.

3. Learned counsel appearing for respondent Nos.1 and 2 has submitted that there is fee outstanding with the petitioner and in case, the petitioner would pay the same, then, all the said documents, which are in possession of respondent Nos.1 and 2, would be handed over to her within a period of three days from the date the said fee is deposited by the petitioner.

4. Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that the said statement made on behalf of respondent Nos.1 and 2 satisfies the claim of the petitioner completely and the petitioner would deposit the outstanding fee within a period of three weeks from today and in case of depositing the same by the petitioner, the said documents be returned to her either on the same day or within a period of three days of the said deposit.

5. Keeping in view the above-said facts and circumstances, the present writ petition is disposed of, as having been rendered infructuous. In case, the petitioner deposits the fee within a period of three weeks from today with the respondent Nos.1 and 2, then, respondent Nos.1 and 2 would hand over the original documents to the petitioner, which are in their possession, either on the same day or within a period of three days from the deposit of fee.
