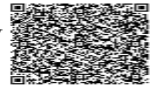

AMARJOT BHATTI, J.

1. Petitioners Dimple Kaler and Kartik have filed instant petition under Article 226 of Constitution of India for directions to respondent Nos.1 to 3 to protect their life and liberty as they are facing imminent threat to their life and liberty from the hands of respondent Nos.4 to 6.
2. It was alleged that both petitioners are major. They are living together for the last 4 years. After attaining marriagable age, they will perform marriage. Respondent Nos.4 to 6 are against their relationship and they are extending threats.
3. On this petition, notice was given and status report was called for. As per status report, private respondents appeared in Police Station on 25.05.2024 and suffered their statements that they have never threatened



petitioners nor they have any concern with them. They can reside wherever they wish to reside and no harm will be caused to their life and liberty.

4. In view of the status report, counsel for petitioners stated that now there is no apprehension of threat and their petition may be disposed of as same is rendered infructuous.

5. Since at present there is no threat perception to petitioners, therefore, present petition stands disposed of having rendered infructuous. However, in case there is any threat perception in the mind of present petitioners they can approach respondent Nos.2 and 3 who will consider threat perception and will take necessary steps.

6. With these directions petition is, accordingly, disposed of.

7. Pending application (s), if any also stands disposed of.
