1. The present revision petition has been filed under Article 227 of the Constitution of India for setting aside the order dated 09.02.2024 (Annexure P-8) passed by the Ld. Civil Judge (Jr. Division), Hoshiarpur in CS No.482 of 2017 titled as “Naresh Kumar Vs. Krishna Devi and others” pending for 10.07.2024, whereby documentary evidence of the petitioner was closed by order.
2. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner wants to produce on record jamabandi for the years 2016-17, 2021-22, 1969-70 and Khasra girdawari w.e.f. Sauni 2022 to Hari 2024 by way of documentary evidence and there is no need to prove these documents. He further submits that petitioner did not want to call any witness to prove these documents but only wants to tender these documents in affirmative evidence.
3. After arguing for some time, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that petitioner would be satisfied if one opportunity is granted to the petitioner to produce the documentary evidence. The case is fixed for

10.07.2024 before the learned trial Court.

4. I have heard the submissions made by the learned counsel for the petitioner and perused the paper-book.
5. If notice is given to the other side it may further delay the disposal of case and may further put financial burden upon respondent.
6. Without commenting upon the merits of the case and in the interest of justice, order dated 09.02.2024 (Annexure P-8) passed by the Ld. Civil Judge (Jr. Division), Hoshiarpur is hereby set aside and this petition is disposed of with a direction to the concerned Court to give one opportunity to the petitioner to tender the above mentioned documents in the evidence on 10.07.2024 at own responsibility subject to payment of costs of Rs.5000/- to be paid to the opposite party.
7. If the respondent is not satisfied with this order, he can move an application for recalling of this order within 30 days.
8. Petition stands disposed of.
