AMARJOT BHATTI, J. (Oral)

1. Petitioner Gulab Singh has filed instant criminal writ petition under Article 226 of Constitution of India for issuance of writ in the nature of mandamus directing official respondent Nos.2 to 4 to protect his life and liberty and of his family members, who are apprehending threat from respondent No.5 and his associates.

2. Learned counsel for petitioner argued that earlier Gulab Singh and Sewa Singh respondent No.5 were friends and due to some misunderstanding respondent No.5 apprehended that audio recording was shown by petitioner to the wife of respondent No.5 because of this reason respondent No.5 started extending threats to petitioner and his family.

3. Status report has been received. ASI Nazar Singh during inquiry joined both the parties. It was revealed that compromise has been arrived at through Panchayat on 05.06.2024. Copy of compromise is Annexure R-1/T.

On the basis of this compromise, inquiry report dated 05.06.2024 was



submitted before SHO, Police Station Lehra, District Sangrur. Today affidavit of petitioner is also produced confirming compromise.

4. In view of status report and the affidavit produced by HC Jagraj Singh No.1853, Police Station Lehra, Sangrur where it is clear that matter has been compromised between petitioner and respondent No.5. Therefore, there is no threat perception and the present petition filed by petitioner stands disposed of having rendered infructuous.
