1. Through the instant petition, filed under Section 438 of Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973, the petitioner seeks anticipatory bail in case FIR No. 102, dated 24.04.2024, under Sections 452, 427, 506, 148 and 149 of IPC (Section 323 of IPC added later on) at Police Station Jandiala, District Amritsar (Rural).
2. Vide order dated 31.05.2024, passed by this Court, the petitioner was released on interim bail and was directed to join investigation. Order dated 31.05.2024, passed by this Court, reads as under:

“Learned counsel for the petitioner inter alia submits that injury attributed to the petitioner is simple in nature, besides it, he is ready to tender his unconditional apology to complainant-Harjit Singh as well as the injured-Mangal Singh. He also submits that the petitioner is a young boy of 19 years of age and is a first-time offender.

In the meanwhile, petitioner will join investigation before the Investigating Officer as and when called. In the event of his arrest, the Arresting Officer would admit him to interim bail, till the next date of hearing, on his furnishing adequate bail and surety bonds to his satisfaction. The petitioner is also directed to abide by all the conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) of Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973.

On his own volition, the petitioner undertakes to furnish his affidavit/undertaking as regards his unconditional apology tendered to the complainant and the injured before the next date of hearing.”

3. Learned State counsel, on instructions from the Investigating Officer, has submitted that that the petitioner has joined investigation on 13.08.2024 and he is not required for custodial interrogation.
4. Keeping in view the above mentioned facts and circumstances, without commenting on the merits of the case, the present petition is allowed and the order dated 31.05.2024, granting interim bail to the petitioner, is made absolute, subject to the conditions laid down in Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure.
