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SANJIV BERRY, J. (ORAL)

By way of present petition filed under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973, petitioner seeks quashing of FIR (Annexure P-1) and all consequential proceedings arising therefrom on the basis of compromise/settlement dated 24.05.2024 (Annexure P-2) executed between the parties. Details of the FIR are as follows:

2. With the intervention of respectables and elderly people of the society, the parties have arrived at a settlement vide compromise/settlement dated 24.05.2024 (Annexure P-2), which is duly



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signed by them. The matter was referred to the Court below for recording of statements of the parties and to report with respect to genuineness of the compromise arrived at between the parties. Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate, Narnaul, vide report dated 15.06.2024, has apprised this Court that the compromise arrived at between the parties is genuine and without any pressure. In compliance to the order dated 04.06.2024, an amount of Rs.10000/- has been deposited with the Poor Patients Welfare Fund, PGIMER, Chandigarh and receipt thereof is annexed with the report.

3. Respondent No. 2 is represented by his counsel and does not oppose the compromise.

4. In view of the report of the Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate, Narnaul and in view of the decision of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in "*Gian Singh Vs. State of Punjab and another*", 2012(4) RCR (Criminal) 543 and "*Narinder Singh and Others Vs. State of Punjab and Another*", (2014) 6 SCC 466, this Court is of the opinion that no useful purpose can be served by keeping with the criminal proceedings pending, since the complainant has himself compromised the dispute with the petitioners/ accused persons.

5. In the circumstances, the present petition is allowed. FIR No. 203 dated 21.05.2023 under Sections 4323, 34, 506 IPC (Section 325 IPC added later on), registered at Police Station Sadar Narnaul, District Mahendergarh (Annexure P-1) and all consequential proceedings arising



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therefrom, are hereby quashed on the basis of compromise qua the present petitioners.
