DEEPAK MANCHANDA J. (ORAL)

The petitioners have approached this Court under Article 226 of the Constitution of India seeking issuance of directions to respondents No.2 and 3 for protecting their lives and liberty from respondents No. 4 to 11.

The contention of learned counsel for the petitioners is that both the petitioners are major, aged about 26 years and about 28 years respectively. In support thereof, copies of Aadhaar Cards pertaining to the petitioners have been appended (Annexures P-1 & P-2). The learned counsel for petitioners further contends that they have performed marriage against the wishes of their parents and the marriage of the petitioners was solemnized on 05.06.2024. Copy of Marriage Certificate (Annexure P-3) and copy of photographs of marriage (Annexure P-4) have also been appended. He further contends that the petitioners apprehend threat to their lives and liberty and claim that there is a constant danger of being implicated in a false case and even a representation dated 05.06.2024 (Annexure P-5) has been sent by the petitioners to the respondent No.2-Senior Superintendent of Police,



Kapurthala but the same has not been decided till date and the petitioners would be satisfied if the said representation is decided in a time bound manner.

Notice of motion restricted to respondents No.1 to 3 only.

At this stage, Mr. Amit Kumar Goyal, Addl. AG Punjab accepts notice on behalf of respondents No.1 to 3 and has no objection if appropriate directions are given for deciding the representation submitted by the petitioners.

Therefore, without examining the question of legality and validity of the marriage and expressing any opinion thereon, the petition is disposed of with the directions to respondent No.2-Senior Superintendent of Police, Kapurthala to look into the grievance of the petitioners as set out in the petition and also expressed in the representation (Annexure P-5) and take appropriate action for protection of their lives and liberty as may be warranted by the circumstances in accordance with law.

The Registry is directed to send a copy of this order along with copy of the petition to respondent No.2-Senior Superintendent of Police, Kapurthala for requisite compliance.

The petition is disposed of.
