1. This petition has been filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C. seeking anticipatory bail in case bearing FIR No.51 dated 16.03.2024 under Sections 306/34 of IPC, registered at Police Station Sadar Amritsar, District Amritsar City.

2. On 18.06.2024, the following order was passed:-

“Prayer in the present petition is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.0051 dated 16.03.2024 under Sections 306/34 of Indian Penal Code, registered at Police Station Sadar Amritsar, District Amritsar City.

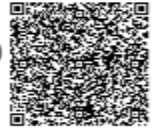
It has been submitted by counsel for the petitioner that petitioner was married with deceased Rupinder Kaur on 04.12.2016 and they were blessed with one male child who is 4 years of age. He submits that during all these 8 years, there was no complaint regarding harassment caused by the petitioner to the deceased however, unfortunately, the deceased committed suicide by consuming poison on 14.03.2024. He further submits that the petitioner and his whole family has been roped in the present FIR on the allegation of harassment and abetting the suicide. He further submits that from the facts and circumstances of the case, no case under Section 306 read with Section 107 IPC is made out against the petitioner. It is submitted that no case for custodial interrogation is made out. He further submits that co-accused i.e. mother and sister of the petitioner have already been granted bail.

Notice of motion for 13.08.2024.

In the meantime, in the event of arrest, the petitioner shall be released on interim bail subject to the satisfaction of the Arresting/Investigating Officer. The petitioner shall join investigation before the Investigating Agency/Officer. He shall abide by the following conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C:-

(i) That the petitioner shall make himself available for interrogation by a police officer as and when required to do so.

(ii) That the petitioner shall not directly or indirectly make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade



him from disclosing such facts to the court or to any police officer.

(iii) That the petitioner shall not leave India without prior permission of the court.”

3. Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Baljinder Singh, at the very outset, informs the Court that the petitioner has joined the investigation and his custodial interrogation is not required.

4. In view of the statement of learned State counsel, order dated 18.06.2024 is hereby made absolute. The petitioner shall abide by the terms and conditions envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

5. The petition stands disposed of.
