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DEEPAK SIBAL, J. (Oral)

1. Through the present petition, the petitioner seeks issuance of directions to the respondents to grant compensatory marks on account of loss of examination time suffered by the petitioner while appearing for the (NEET) UG - 2024 examination.

2. Through a petition filed before the Supreme Court under Article 32 of the Indian Constitution being **Writ Petition (Civil) No.368 of 2024 – Alakh Pandey vs. National Testing Agency and another**, challenge had been made to grant of compensatory marks to 1563 candidates who had appeared in the National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test (NEET) UG-2024 examination. In such proceedings, the National Testing Agency (for short – NTA) had submitted before the Supreme Court that the decision of the NTA with regard to grant of grace marks had been withdrawn and that the NTA had further decided to hold a re-test for the 1563 candidates who had



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been granted compensatory marks. The Supreme Court, after accepting the said later decision by the NTA, permitted the holding of the re-test and then specifically passed an order closing of the issue with regard to grant of compensatory marks.

3. In the light of the above, no further orders are required to be passed in the present petition especially when as per the later decision by the NTA, the re-test also stands conducted on 23.06.2024.
