(1). The petitioner has filed the present writ petition under Article 226 of the Constitution seeking a writ of mandamus directing the respondents No.1 & 2 to provide security/protection to the life and liberty of the petitioner from respondents No.3 to 4 who are harassing him on the basis of false complaint filed by respondent No.5. He also seeks indulgence of this Court to refer the matter to the Mediation and Reconciliation Centre as the parties are likely to settle the dispute. Alternatively, he also seeks a direction to respondents No.1 to 2 to decide his representation dated 01.07.2024 (Annexure P4) and get the matter enquired through independent agency.

(2). It is the apprehension of the petitioner that Manjinder Kaur and Baljit Kaur - respondent No.5 & 6, respectively are illegally demanding money from the petitioner and are also threatening to commit suicide in his house.

(3). The petition is half-baked and premature wherein on the basis of presumption and assumption only, the petitioner has approached this Court. The petitioner has failed to make out any cause of action to show if there was

actually any threat to his life and liberty at the hands of the respondents. If the petitioner has any apprehension that respondents No.5&6 would commit suicide, he is free to move the police authorities who are bound to act in accordance with law.

(4). The writ petition is dismissed being premature and without any cause of action.
