Prayer in the present application is for placing on record
ticket dated 10.08.2024.

For the reasons mentioned in the application, same is
allowed. Annexure A-2 is taken on record.

CRM-M-32655-2024

Prayer in the present petition is for issuance of direction to
the Arresting Officer/Ld. Trial Court to release the petitioner on bail in
the event of his arrest in case FIR No.6 dated 20.12.2023 for offence
under Sections 420, 406, 409, 506 and 120-B IPC, registered at Police
Station NRI Patiala, District Patiala. Further prayer for any other relief to
which the petitioner is found entitled has also been made and stay of
arrest of the petitioner, during the pendency of the present petition, is also
prayed for.



Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that the petitioner has been falsely implicated in the present matter with mala fide intention. He submits that the matter is purely of civil nature and the petitioner is ready to return to India and join the proceedings, in this regard, he has placed on record the ticket of the petitioner dated 10.08.2024 as Annexure A-2, which shows that the petitioner will land at Indira Gandhi International Airport, Delhi on 11.08.2024. He prays for granting the petitioner some protection from arrest so that he may be able to appear before the trial Court.

Learned State counsel as well as learned counsel for the respondent/complainant have opposed the submissions made by learned counsel for the petitioner and submit that the case relates to the year 2023 and by absconding abroad, petitioner is not entitled for any relief from this Court.

Heard.

In view of the above position when the petitioner is ready to come to India and join the proceedings, this Court deems it appropriate to dispose of the present petition with a direction that in case the petitioner lands at Indira Gandhi International Airport, Delhi on 11.08.2024 and appears before the trial Court within a period of 10 days from the date of his landing in India and moves an appropriate application for bail, the trial Court would decide the same expeditiously within a period of 02 days from the date of its filing. The petitioner will have protection from arrest for a period of 10 days from the date of his landing in India i.e. 11.08.2024.



Needless to say that in case the petitioner fails to comply with the above direction, then the protection granted by this Court would be deemed to have been vacated.
