JAGMOHAN BANSAL, J (ORAL)

1. Mr. Sanyam Khetarpal, Advocate has put in appearance on behalf of respondent No. 6 and filed Power of Attorney, which is taken on record. Registry is directed to tag the same at an appropriate place.
2. The petitioner through instant petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India is seeking setting aside of order dated 25.06.2024 (Annexure P-14) whereby Appellate Authority has dismissed his appeal and upheld order dated 09.06.2023 (Annexure P-5) passed by Adjudicating Authority.
3. The petitioner was elected as Sarpanch of Gram Panchayat, village Bai Khera (Tethar) on 12.11.2022. On the complaint of Bhupender Singh, respondents conducted an inquiry and concluded that matriculation certificate furnished by petitioner is a piece of forged document. The petitioner during the



course of hearing before Appellate Authority, submitted one report received from Education Board. The Appellate Authority deputed two officials to visit office of Madhya Pradesh State Open School Education Board and get complete information. The said Board reiterated its earlier reports.

4. Mr. Vikram Singh, Advocate submits that inquiry was not conducted in the manner prescribed. The matriculation certificate submitted by petitioner is not a forged document. Report dated 22.04.2024, (Annexure P-10) of Education Board, Bhopal is contrary to other reports.

5. By order dated 31.07.2024, this Court directed Madhya Pradesh State Open School Education Board, Bhopal to confirm genuineness of Matriculation Certificate furnished by petitioner.

6. The aforesaid Board has sent its report dated 16.08.2024 which is taken on record. Registry is directed to tag the same at an appropriate place.

7. From the perusal of report, it is evident beyond the pale of doubt that petitioner has submitted forged Matriculation Certificate. The Board has initiated proceedings against its officers on account of issuing different confirmation letters.

8. In the wake of the report of Board, there is no question to disbelieve that petitioner had furnished a forged and fabricated Matriculation Certificate. He had violated conditions prescribed for participating in the selection process. The petitioner seems to be so bold and daring that despite knowing the fact that his Matriculation Certificate is a forged document, has approached this Court seeking setting-aside of orders passed by authorities which are based upon the findings that petitioner has furnished a forged document.

9. In the wake of aforesaid facts and findings, this Court is of the considered opinion that present petition deserves to be dismissed and accordingly dismissed.
10. The Competent Authority is advised to take appropriate action against the petitioner for filing forged documents.
