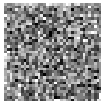

The present petition has been filed by the petitioner under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, seeking a writ of mandamus, directing the respondents to consider the claim of the petitioner for regularization in the light of Policy dated 18.03.2011 (Annexure P-4) on the ground that junior persons have been regularized by considering the award of the Labour Court, Patiala, dated 16.04.1999 (Annexure P-1) and to release the culminating benefits along with interest @ 12% per annum.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the respondent-Markfed has now issued letter dated 31.07.2023, for considering the cases of ad-hoc, contractual, daily wages, work charge and temporary employees, who are working for the last 10 years, for regularization and information has been sought from the concerned employees in the shape of performa as per Schedule-A and Schedule-B



attached with the said letter. He further submits that the said information as sought vide letter dated 31.07.2023 has already been furnished by the petitioner and his case is already under consideration with the respondents.

3. Learned counsel for respondents No.2 and 3, submits that the case of the petitioner is under consideration and the same shall be finalized in terms of the policy/instructions of the Markfed, within a period of 04 months.

4. In view of the above, the instant writ petition has been rendered infructuous and the same is disposed of accordingly.
