AMARJOT BHATTI, J.

1. Petitioner Suresh Chand has filed criminal writ petition under Articles 226 and 227 of Constitution of India for issuance of appropriate direction in the nature of Certiorari for quashing impugned order dated 02.06.2022, Annexure P-5, passed by respondent No. 1, rejecting pre-mature release of petitioner and for any other appropriate direction.
2. Learned P.P, UT, Chandigarh on previous date submitted that present petitioner has already filed fresh application for pre-mature release which is under process. Today learned counsel for petitioner has confirmed this fact.
3. Learned P.P, UT, Chandigarh has also stated that since second application has been filed for pre-mature release, same is under consideration and it will take about six weeks for its disposal. Custody certificate dated 24.07.2024 is also produced, according to which, at present petitioner is on parole, having been released on 27.06.2024 for a period of 28 days and he is to surrender on due date i.e. 26.07.2024.

Considering the aforesaid facts, present petition filed by petitioner has rendered infructuous. Respondents are directed to expeditiously dispose of application filed by petitioner for pre-mature release, preferably within a period of six weeks.

4. Writ Petition is accordingly, disposed of, as having been rendered infructuous.

5. Pending miscellaneous application(s), if any, stand disposed of accordingly as well.
