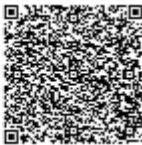

1. The petitioner has filed the instant writ petition under
Article 226 of the Constitution of India seeking a writ of certiorari,
quashing the order dated 18.04.2022 (Annexure P-4) to the extent that
the same allows the disbursement of the pensionary benefits of the
petitioner in installments and not in one go and also to the extent that
the same does not allow the payment of arrears of increments and D.A.
amounting to Rs.8,54,936/- already determined and passed by resolution



dated 31.07.2018 (Annexure P-2) and further to the extent that the same has not allowed interest on the delayed payments.

2. Learned counsel for the parties are ad idem that the matter has been compromised between the petitioner and respondent No.3 vide resolution dated 20.08.2024. The necessary benefits have been determined and are being paid to the petitioner as per terms and conditions of the said resolution. Copy of resolution dated 20.08.2024 is taken on record.
