1. The present petition has been filed by the petitioner under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India seeking a writ of mandamus, directing the respondents to grant one notional increment for the period mentioned in para 3 of the writ petition after completion of one year service of the petitioner and thereafter, revise the pension and pensionary benefits of the petitioner after giving the benefit of one notional increment along with interest @ 18% per annum.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner, at the very outset, confines her prayer for deciding representation dated 28.05.2024 (Annexure P-2). She submits that at this stage, the petitioner would be satisfied, if the said representation is decided by passing a speaking order within a time bound frame.

3. Notice of motion.

4. Mr. Munish Gupta, Advocate has put in appearance and accepts notice on behalf of the respondents and has no objection to the innocuous prayer made by learned counsel for the petitioner.



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5. I have heard learned counsel for the parties and have gone through the record of the case.

6. Without going into the merits of the case at this stage, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.3, to decide representation dated 28.05.2024 (Annexure P-2) submitted by the petitioner, expeditiously by passing a speaking order, preferably within a period of 03 months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.
