1. This is a contempt petition filed under Section 12 of the Contempt of Courts Act, for initiating contempt proceedings against the respondent for disobeying the order dated 16.08.2023 passed in CWP-37979-2018.

2. Notice of motion.

3. Mr. Pawan Kumar Longia, DAG, Haryana and Mr. Harkesh Kumar, AAG, Haryana, accept notice on behalf of the respondent and have submitted that the interest by making the calculation at the rate of 6% per annum has already been paid to the petitioner. Documents to this effect have been placed on record today in the Court. The same are taken on record. Registry is directed to scan the same and place it at appropriate place.

4. However, learned counsel for the petitioner has disputed the amount payable to the petitioner, though he has not disputed that the respondent has paid the interest amount by making calculation at the rate of 6% per annum.



5. Aggrieved against the action of the respondent, the petitioner had served a legal notice. However, the respondent has decided the said legal notice moved by the petitioner, as well. The assertions made by the petitioner have been rejected by the respondent. Accordingly, the order passed by the Writ Court stands complied with.
6. In view of the above, the present petition is rendered infructuous and dismissed, as such.
7. However, if any grievance of the petitioner is left un-redressed, he would be at liberty to avail any other alternate remedy, but in accordance with law.
