For the reasons assigned in the application, seeking condonation of delay of 92 days in filing the revision, the same is allowed. The delay of 92 days in filing the instant revision petition, is condoned.

CRR-1837-2022

1. Through the instant revision petition, challenge is thrown to the order dated 22.12.2021, whereby, the learned trial Court has framed the charges against the present petitioners and a prayer is made to allow the application under Section 239 read with Section 240 of Cr.P.C., 1973, thereby discharging the revisionists from the instant FIR.
2. Learned counsel for the respondent-CBI, informs this Court that

only three witnesses are left to be examined, in the FIR (supra).

3. Considering the fact that the trial is now at fag end, as only three witnesses are left to be examined, therefore, this Court, at this stage, refrains itself to grant the asked for relief. Accordingly, the instant revision petition is **dismissed**.
4. However, liberty is granted to the present petitioners, to raise all the pleas, which are raised through the instant revision, before the learned trial Court concerned, at the relevant time.
5. Pending applications, if any, stand disposed of accordingly.
