1. Instant writ petition has been filed by the petitioner under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India for issuance of directions to respondent No.1 to stop the recovery of Rs.45,707/- per month from the salary of the petitioner till the pendency of the statutory appeal dated 24.06.2024 (Annexure P-8) filed by the petitioner against the order of punishment dated 11.06.2024 (Annexure P-7) passed by respondent No.1, whereby recovery of Rs.1,21,22,041/- has been imposed on the petitioner and in the alternative to stay the operation of the orders dated 11.06.2024 (Annexure P-7 issued on 19.06.2024) till respondent No.2 – Appellate Authority of the respondent – Corporation decides the statutory appeal dated 24.06.2024 (Annexure P-8) filed by the petitioner.



2. Learned counsel for the petitioner prays for deciding the appeal dated 24.06.2024 (Annexure P-8) filed by the petitioner expeditiously by passing a speaking order in a time-bound manner.

3. Notice of motion.

4. Mr. Karminder Singh, Advocate, accepts notice on behalf of the respondents and submits that he has no objection if the time-bound directions are issued to the Appellate Authority to consider and decide the appeal filed by the petitioner.

5. I have heard learned counsel for the parties and have gone through the case file.

6. Respondent No.2-Appellate Authority is directed to decide the appeal dated 24.06.2024 (Annexure P-8) filed by the petitioner, in accordance with law by passing a speaking order as expeditiously as possible preferably within a period of six months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

7. Since the statutory appeal filed by the petitioner is pending and yet to be decided, it will be in the interest of justice that no further recovery be effected from the petitioner.

8. Petition stands disposed of in the above terms.
