1. By way of present petition, prayer has been made for initiation of contempt proceedings against the respondent on account of alleged willful non-compliance of order dated 13.12.2023 passed by this Court in CWP-27848-2023.

2. In pursuance of last order, affidavit of Mr. Yogesh Ranga, Estate Officer, HSVP, Panipat i.e. respondent has been filed in Court today and the same is taken on record. As per the same, a letter dated 18.10.2024 has been issued to the petitioner regarding allotment of alternative plot No.486, Sector 7, U.E., Panipat.

3. Learned counsel for the respondent, on instructions, submits that possession of the aforementioned plot shall be handed over to the petitioner

within a period of one week from today.

4. In view of the above, learned counsel for the petitioner does not want to press the present petition.

5. Dismissed as not pressed. Rule stands discharged.

6. However, in case the needful is not done within the aforementioned period, as per the undertaking, the petitioner would be at liberty to seek revival of contempt petition and in that eventuality, the erring/concerned officer would be liable to pay a sum of Rs.50,000/- as costs from his/her own pocket in favour of the petitioner towards litigation expenses, immediately, i.e. on the first date of listing of revival application.
