Present petition has been filed under Article 226 of the Constitution of India for release of the detainee (Sehajdeep Singh), who has been illegally detained by private respondent No.4 since 17.06.2024 and to produce the detainee before this Hon'ble Court. Further prayer has been made that warrant officer may kindly be appointed to release the detainee.

The petitioner-mother is present in Court and has fairly submitted before this Court that she went to her in-laws house and met the child and faced no problem whatsoever. However, she has submitted that she should be given the visiting rights so as to meet the child. She has expressed her concern that as she is working and hence, she finds it difficult to visit her son at the place which is more than 100 kms far from her place of resident. She submits that she should be granted opportunity as per her availability and the respondents be also directed when she does



not find the time to visit there, the child should be brought to her. The petitioner has also submitted before this Court that in the present facts and circumstances, though she has lodged the FIR against the respondent, however, in the present scenario, she is not interested in pursuing the same and they are in the process of compromising the same so as to quash the FIR.

The Court finds that the submissions made are reasonable and thus, dispose of the present petition with liberty to both the parties to make the necessary arrangements for enabling the mother to meet her child as per availability of their time and whenever the mother has time she is at liberty to visit the child and when she finds it difficult she can inform respondent No.4, who will bring the child to the mother.

Disposed of in above terms.
