MAHABIR SINGH SINDHU, J.

Present petition has been filed under Section 438 of Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of pre-arrest bail to the petitioner in FIR No. 96 dated 03.06.2021, Under Sections 379B, 323 read with Section 34 of Indian Penal Code, 1860, registered at Police Station Talwandi Sabo, District Bathinda.

(2) The then Coordinate Bench on 12.10.2021, passed the following order:-

“ Learned counsel contends that the FIR was registered on the allegation that a number of persons including the petitioner waylaid the complainant and inflicted injuries with petitioner being attributed dang blow on the knee of the complainant while the other co-accused snatched Rs.20,000/- and a mobile phone from the complainant and fled from the spot. Learned counsel contends that the petitioner has been implicated in a false case as a counterblast to the FIR got registered by the petitioner’s father in the year 2019 against the complainant’s father. Learned counsel further contends that due to intervention of respectable persons of the area, the matter has been amicably resolved. Learned counsel requests for time to place copy of the FIR registered by the petitioner’s father against the complainant’s father as also the compromise on record.

List as and when needful is done.”

- (3) Today no one has come forward on behalf of petitioner.
- (4) Learned State counsel on instructions from the quarter concerned has apprised the Court that after investigation of the aforesaid FIR, cancellation report was submitted before the Court of competent jurisdiction and the same is stated to be still under consideration.
- (5) In view of the above, present petition is disposed off at this stage. However, it is made clear that in case occasion so arises, petitioner would be at liberty to take recourse to the remedy available under law.
- (6) Pending application(s), if any, shall also stand disposed off.
