VIKAS BAHL, J.(ORAL)

1. Present Civil Writ Petition has been filed under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India praying for issuance of a writ in the nature of certiorari quashing the order dated 02.04.2019 passed by respondent No. 1, allowing the application under the Maintenance and Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizen Act, 2007.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioners as well as counsel for respondent No. 2 have submitted that the matter was referred to the Mediation and Conciliation Centre of this Court and a detailed settlement/agreement dated 22.08.2023 has been arrived at and as per the

said settlement/agreement, the petitioners have to take care of respondent No. 2 and provide food, clothing, shelter and medical assistance and also have to pay an amount of Rs.3,000/- per month to respondent No. 2. It is further submitted that the impugned order would be modified in terms of the said settlement/agreement dated 22.08.2023.

3. Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case, the impugned order dated 02.04.2019 is modified in terms of the settlement/agreement dated 22.08.2023 and both the parties would be bound by the terms and conditions of the said settlement/agreement.

4. Needless to say, in case, either of the parties violates the said terms and conditions of the agreement, it would be open to the other party to move an application for recalling the present order.
