1. The present application under Section 5 of the Limitation Act has been filed for condonation of delay of 769 days in filing the present revision petition.
2. Learned counsel for the applicant/petitioner *inter alia* contends that initially the petitioner-husband had been appearing through counsel before the Family Court, Panipat but later on he could not continue with the proceedings, as such proceeded against *ex parte*.
3. There is no satisfactory explanation for the delay in filing the present revision petition.
4. Consequently, the present application is devoid of any merits.
5. In view of the above, the application stands dismissed.

Main case

1. As the application for condonation of delay in filing the petition is dismissed, as such, the present revision petition also stands dismissed being beyond the period of limitation.
