Through the instant petition filed under Section 482 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023, prayer is made for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case arising out FIR No.0090 dated 01.07.2024, under Sections 306 & 34 of IPC registered at Police Station Samana, District Patiala.

2. Brief facts relevant for the purpose of disposal of this petition are that on 30.06.2024, on receipt of a telephonic information regarding committing of suicide by one Kulwant Singh and his dead body lying at Dead House, Civil Hospital, Samana, a police party reached there and recorded statement of the complainant Jora Singh father of the victim to the effect that the victim who was his youngest son was married with the



petitioner on 06.12.2023. The petitioner had been harassing and extending beatings to the victim ever since her marriage and had left her matrimonial house about four months back. The complainant and his family members had tried to prevail good sense upon her and brought her back. On 10.03.2024, she again went back to her parental home after having a quarrel with the victim. On 25.06.2024, the petitioner along with his daughters had gone to the parental village of the petitioner to bring her back but his daughter and himself were insulted by the petitioners and her father refused to send the petitioner back. The complainant on coming back to his house had disclosed about the entire incident to the victim and unable to tolerate the insult of his family members, the victim had ended his life by hanging himself with a wire after tying with the fan in his room.

3. After registration of FIR, investigation proceedings have been initiated and are underway. Apprehending her arrest, the petitioner had moved an application for grant of pre-arrest bail which had been dismissed by Court of learned Additional Sessions Judge Patiala vide order dated 22.07.2024.

4. Vide order dated 05.09.2024, the petitioner had been directed to join the investigation in this case. It is submitted by learned State counsel today that the petitioner joined the investigation on 17.09.2024 and her custodial interrogation is not required. It is also submitted that she has been falsely implicated in this case. The ingredients for commission of offence under Section 306 IPC have not been made out as against the petitioner at all. No purpose would be served by detaining her in custody. Her custodial



interrogation is not required. In view of the said facts but without commenting on the merits of the case, the present petition is allowed and the order dated 05.09.2024 granting interim bail to the petitioner is made absolute, subject to the conditions laid down in Section 482 (2) of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (for short BNSS), 2023.
