1. In the present writ petition, the grievance being raised by the petitioner is that the petitioner is a married daughter of deceased employee and the only objection taken while rejecting the claim vide impugned order dated 06.04.2024 (Annexure P-2) is that the petitioner is the married daughter whereas, even the married daughter who was dependent upon the deceased, is entitled for compassionate appointment.

3. Mr. Amarpreet Singh Bains, learned Assistant Advocate General, Punjab, who is present in the Court, accepts notice on behalf of the respondents.

4. Learned counsel for the respondents very fairly submits that as per the instructions, which govern the issue of the grant of compassionate appointment, the married daughters are also entitled subject to the fact that the said married daughter was dependent upon the deceased employee at the time of his death so as to claim the benefit of compassionate appointment and as, no such fact has been noticed in the impugned order whether the petitioner was dependent or not, the respondents will pass a fresh order with regard to the claim of the petitioner for the grant of compassionate appointment and the said fresh order will be passed within a period of eight weeks from the date of receipt of copy of this order.

5. Learned counsel for the respondents further submits that the petitioner be directed to furnish her financial status to the State so that appropriate opinion could be formed whether the petitioner was dependent upon her father or not so as to claim compassionate appointment.

6. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that within a period of two weeks from today, the financial status of the petitioner will be brought to the notice of the Department for their consideration qua the grant of compassionate appointment.

7. Learned counsel for the petitioner further submits that as the respondents have undertaken to pass a fresh order, the present writ petition may kindly be disposed of having been not pressed any further.
