MANJARI NEHRU KAUL, J. (ORAL)

1. The petitioner is seeking the concession of bail under Section 438 Cr.P.C. in case FIR No.67 dated 21.04.2023 under Sections 452, 323, 427, 148, 149 IPC registered at Police Station Sadar Fazilka, District Fazilka.

2. On the last date of hearing, i.e. 09.08.2023, a Coordinate Bench of this Court had granted the concession of interim bail to the petitioner and asked him to join investigation.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that in compliance of the order dated 09.08.2023, the petitioner has joined investigation and cooperated with the investigating agency.

4. Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Jaswant Singh, does not dispute the factum of the petitioner having joined investigation and cooperated with the investigating agency. It has also been submitted by the learned State counsel that the petitioner has been attributed simple injuries on non-vital parts of the body of the complainant. He, on further instructions submits that the petitioner is not required for further investigation much less for his custodial interrogation.

5. In the circumstances, the petition is allowed and the interim order dated 09.08.2023 is made absolute subject to the conditions laid down in Section 438(2) Cr.P.C. Needless to say, in case the petitioner misuses the concession of bail granted to him, the State would be at liberty to seek cancellation of the bail granted to him.
