1. The petitioners have approached this Court by filing the present writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India for issuance of directions to the respondents to release the due monetary benefits to the petitioners on account of the overtime work done by them from October 2013 to December 2016 along with interest.
2. Pursuant to notice of motion order, short reply has been filed by the respondents wherein it has been mentioned as under :-

“2. The petitioners have filed above mentioned petition claiming the payment of the overtime bill submitted by them till 12/2016. However, it would be relevant to state herein that the payment of the overtime done by the petitioners has already been paid till 12/2017. The attested

receipts elaborating the payment details of the same are herein attached as Annexure R-1.

3. Rather it would be relevant to state herein that the petitioners herein have sought payment of overtime done by them till 2017 but in this present case at hand due payments till march 2022 stand paid on part of the Respondent-corporation.”

3. Learned counsel for the respondents submits that the overtime allowances even for the subsequent period has also been released. He further submits that since the relief claimed in the present petition has already been granted, therefore, the present petition has been rendered infructuous.

4. Learned counsel for the petitioners could not dispute the abovesaid factual position.

5. Disposed of as having become infructuous.
