RAJESH BHARDWAJ, J. (Oral)

1. Present petition has been filed for directing the official respondents No. 1 to 5 to ensure the security and protection of life and liberty of the petitioner and his family members who are in eminent danger at the hands of private Respondents No.6 & 7 and their muscle men who are trying to illegally take over the possession of the premises of the petitioner and in order to succeed in their ulterior design to take over such possession illegally, the private Respondent No.6 & 7 have placed their muscle men to create ruckus (who are drinking irresponsibly, using abusive language, passing filthy comments and making indecent gestures) at the premises wherein, petitioner's old aged mother and aunt are also staying and further, have attacked the petitioner at one instance and thereafter, after a few days of such attack, further attacked the old aged aunt of the petitioner by dragging her outside the premises and beating

her mercilessly, with the entire episode being recorded in the CCTV



Cameras installed in the premises and further, despite repeated complaints and requests for protection of life and liberty the local Police has failed to ensure such protection to the Petitioner and his family members thereby, violating Fundamental Right of the Petitioner as enshrined under Article 21 of Constitution of India.

2. Learned State counsel has drawn the attention of this Court to the status report dated 30.10.2023. He submits that on examining the allegations of the petitioner, FIR has already been registered against Vipin Kumar and his accomplices i.e. respondent No.6 and others. He thus, submits that the grievance of the petitioner has already been redressed.

3. In view of the status report filed and keeping in view the submissions made, present petition is disposed of with direction to the State to complete the investigation in the FIR, which is registered against respondent No.6 and his other accomplices. However, the petitioner would be at liberty to pursue his remedy as available to him under the law.
