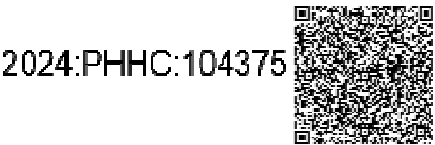

By way of the present petition filed under Section 528 BNSS prayer is for directing the learned SDJM, Ajnala to decide the application dated 09.05.2024 (Annexure P11) of the petitioner for the release of revolver (32 bore) on superdari as the same is pending in case FIR No.218 dated 21.06.2021, under Sections 307, 452, 341, 506, 148 & 149 IPC, registered at Police Station Ajnala, District Amritsar.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that during investigation, the petitioner and some other accused were found innocent by the Superintendent of Police and offences under Sections 148 & 149 IPC were deleted. It was also found that the revolver of the petitioner is not involved in the crime. He further submits that till date, the prosecution failed to file challan though more than three years have elapsed. He further submits that the petitioner moved an application to release his revolver, which is till date pending. He further submits that at this stage, the petitioner would be satisfied if, appropriate directions are issued to SDJM,



Ajnala to take a decision on the application to release the revolver on superdari.

- 3. Notice of motion.
- 4. At the asking of the Court, Mr. R.S. Thind, DAG, Punjab, accepts notice on behalf of respondent(s)-State and submits that the needful will be done in due course. Let a complete set of the paper-book be supplied to him during the course of the day.
- 5. In view of the limited prayer made by the petitioner and without commenting on the merits of the case, the present petition is disposed of at this stage with a direction to SDJM, Ajnala to consider and decide the application dated 09.05.2024 (Annexure P11) of the petitioner expeditiously, by passing a speaking order in accordance with law.
- 6. Pending miscellaneous application(s), if any, also stands disposed of.
