SANDEEP MOUDGIL, J.(ORAL)

1. The petition has been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. for issuance of direction to respondents No.1 to 4 to ensure that the petitioner may not be unnecessarily harassed by the respondent No.5 by calling in his office at the instance of respondents No.6 to 8, in an illegal manner and out of ulterior reasons.

2. Status report dated 02.04.2024 filed by way of an affidavit of Ajinder Singh, PPS, Assistant Inspector General of Police, NRI Affairs, Punjab is taken on record. Para Nos 4 and 5 of the aforesaid report is relevant which reads as under:-

“That after conducting a detail enquiry into the application filed by the Smt. Ranjit Kaur (Respondent No.6), the enquiry report dated 13/3/2024 was forwarded to the D.A Legal for getting opinion and vide letter no. 130/D.A/NRI dated 22.03.2024, D.A Legal opined that the allegations levelled by Respondent No.6 against the Petitioner for abetment to suicide are of serious nature but however, the incidence is stated to be of England in the year 2014. Moreover, during the enquiry Smt. Ranjit Kaur/Respondent no.6, failed to provide any substantial evidence with

regard to the suicide committed by her husband in the year 2014 in England. So, it was recommended that there is no need to take any action on the complaint made by Respondent no.6.

That it is brought to the kind notice to this Hon’ble Court that the first enquiry was conducted by the Deputy Superintendent of Police (Special Branch and Criminal Intelligence), District SBS Nagar. Subsequently, Smt. Ranjit Kaur (Respondent no.6) had given the application to the NRI Wing, SAS Nagar, Mohali and after the enquiry, it has been ascertained that the present dispute is a Civil in nature and further, in respect of the allegation against the petitioner for abetment of suicide, Smt. Ranjit Kaur (Respondent no.6) failed to provide any substantial evidence during the enquiry. Therefore, the present application filed by Smt. Ranjit Kaur (Respondent no.6) has been filed into the office on 22.03.2024 by the Additional Director General of Police, NRI Affairs, Punjab (Respondent no.3)”.

3. In view of aforesaid report, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that he does not wish to press the instant petition at this stage.
4. In the light of above, nothing survives in the present petition. As such, the same is disposed off, as having been rendered infructuous.
