SHEEL NAGU, CHIEF JUSTICE (Oral)

1. This petition under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India has been filed by the petitioners seeking direction for compliance of order/letter dated 10.07.2024 (Annexure P-6) issued by respondent No.2 – University, to the extent it directs Delhi Technical Campus, Bahadurgarh, Jhajjar to shift the existing students to nearby colleges at the earliest, after placing the said Institute in “No Admission” category, qua academic session 2024-25.

2. The students are before this Court alleging that they have not been shifted.



3. On the last occasion, i.e. on 09.08.2024, respondent No.2 – University was directed to seek instructions.
4. Learned counsel for respondent No.2 – University has produced copy of a letter dated 21.08.2024, issued by them, which is taken on record as Mark “X”, revealing that all the five petitioners have been shifted to Sant Kabir Institute of Technology & Management, Bahadurgarh, as per their status in the last session, i.e. 2023-24, with a request to promote them in the next semesters in the session 2024-25 after receiving necessary documents/fees.
5. Learned counsel for the State of Haryana has produced copy of a letter dated 07.08.2024 by the Director General, Directorate of Technical Education, Panchkula, addressed to the Registrar of respondent No.2 – University, requesting to ensure transfer of students of Delhi Technical Campus, Bahadurgarh, to AKIDO College of Engineering, Bahadurgarh. The said letter is taken on record as Mark “Y”.
6. In view of aforesaid subsequent developments, it would not be appropriate to keep this petition pending, which accordingly is disposed of with direction that process of transfer of the petitioners be completed as expeditiously as possible, preferably within a period of seven days.
