1. Petitioner Jaspal Singh has filed first petition under Section 438 Cr.P.C. now under Section 482 of BNSS Act, 2023 for granting anticipatory bail in case FIR No. 0175 dated 19.10.2023, under Sections 420, 120-B of IPC, registered at Police Station Jhunir, District Mansa, Punjab.

2. On the previous date, notice was given to respondent-State and it was fixed for today for filing status report. Status report is filed, which is taken on record, subject to all just exceptions.

3. At this stage, Mr. Jasvir Singh Dhaliwal, Advocate appeared on behalf of complainant and filed his Vakalatnama, which is taken on record. He has also placed on record copy of order dated

13.05.2024 in CRM-M-3871-2024 passed by Coordinate Bench vide

which first anticipatory bail petition filed by Jaspal Singh was dismissed as withdrawn. It is pointed out that petitioner misrepresented before this Court that it is the first anticipatory bail petition. Infact first anticipatory bail petition was dismissed as withdrawn before the Coordinate Bench.

4. I have carefully gone through the contents of anticipatory bail petition. It is rightly pointed out that in the body of petition, it is nowhere mentioned that first anticipatory bail petition was dismissed as withdrawn. Therefore, there is concealment on the part of petitioner in filing second anticipatory bail petition without disclosing about particulars of first anticipatory bail petition.

5. At this stage, learned counsel for petitioner stated that he does not want to pursue the present anticipatory bail petition and seeks permission to withdraw the same.

6. In view of aforesaid factual position, learned counsel for petitioner is allowed to withdraw the present anticipatory bail petition and accordingly, present petition is dismissed as withdrawn.

Since the petitioner tried to conceal material fact from this Court, therefore, he is burdened with cost of ₹25,000/- to be deposited with **Institute for Blind, Sector-26, Chandigarh** within one month from today and receipt of same be placed on file.

7. Pending miscellaneous application(s), if any, stand disposed of accordingly.
