VINOD S. BHARDWAJ, J. (ORAL)

Prayer in the present writ petition was for restraining the respondents from carrying out the work of execution of erection and commissioning of power project without payment of the compensation and following the due procedure of law as mandated under the Telegraph Act, 1885 and the Rules provided thereunder.

Learned counsel for the respondents No.3 to 5/distribution licensee contends that the work of laying, execution and commissioning of the transmission lines has already been completed and that he has specific instructions from the respondent authorities that in the event of the petitioner submitting the requisite documents for processing the claim of the

petitioner for the grant of compensation, the same shall be adjudicated and necessary compensation shall be released in favour of the petitioner.

In view of above said statement made on behalf of the respondents No.3 to 5/distribution licensee, the present writ petition is disposed of at this stage with liberty to the petitioner to approach the respondent No.2-the Deputy Commissioner, Gurugram, along with the application supported by the documents detailed as under:-

- (1) Request form;
- (2) Aadhaar Card;
- (3) Bank copy/cancelled cheque;
- (4) NOC, if more than one owner; and
- (5) Copy of jamabandi attested by Patwari.

In the event of the petitioner approaching the respondent No.2-the Deputy Commissioner, Gurugram, along with the application and above said documents, respondent No.2-the Deputy Commissioner, Gurugram, shall take a decision on the compensation to which the petitioner is entitled within a period of 06 weeks thereafter. The due compensation to the petitioner shall be released within a period of 08 weeks thereafter. The release of the compensation shall be without prejudice to the rights of the petitioner to seek enhancement, if any, in accordance with law.

The present writ petition is disposed of accordingly.
