HARPREET SINGH BRAR J. (Oral)

1. The instant petition is preferred under Section 482 of Bharatiya
Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 read with Section 438 Cr.P.C. seeking
anticipatory bail in FIR No. 46 dated 07.06.2024 under Sections 406, 498-A,
323 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 (for short 'IPC'), registered at Police Station
Women, District Jalandhar.

2. On 14.08.2024, following order was passed:

*"The instant petition is preferred under Section 482 of
Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 read with Section 438
Cr.P.C. seeking anticipatory bail in FIR No.46 dated 07.06.2024
under Sections 406, 498-A, 323 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 (for
short 'IPC'), registered at Police Station Women, District Jalandhar.*

*Learned counsel for the petitioner, inter alia, contends
that due to temperamental differences, a matrimonial dispute has
arisen between the petitioner and his wife. No specific date or
allegations are there against the petitioner and he has been falsely*



*implicated in the present case. FIR (supra) has been lodged out of personal vendetta and private spite to wreak vengeance on the petitioner. All the allegations levelled against the petitioner are implausible and far-fetched. No notice under Section 41-A of Cr.P.C. was served upon the petitioner. Moreover, the maximum sentence provided for the offences, under which the FIR (supra) is registered, is upto 03 years. As such, the petitioner is entitled to anticipatory bail in view of the directions issued by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **Md. Asfak Alam Vs. State of Jharkhand and another, 2023 (3) R.C.R(Criminal) 754**. It is further contended that there is no possibility of the petitioner fleeing from justice and pre-trial detention would cause irreparable loss, mental agony, embarrassment and humiliation to the petitioner as well his entire family.*

Notice of motion for 13.09.2024.

*Keeping in view the ratio of law enunciated by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **Arnesh Kumar Vs. State of Bihar, (2014) 8 SCC 273, Arnab Manoranjan Goswami Vs. State of Maharashtra, (2021) 2 SCC 427, Satender Kumar Antil Vs. CBI, (2022) 10 SCC 51, Siddharam Satlingappa Mhetre Vs. State of Maharashtra and ors., 2010 SCC OnLine SC 1375 and Shri Gurbaksh Singh Sibbia Vs. State of Punjab, (1980) 2 SCC 565**, the petitioner is directed to appear before Investigating Officer within a period of two weeks from today and thereafter, as directed by the Investigating Officer. In the event of arrest, the petitioner shall be admitted to interim bail on furnishing bail/surety bonds to the satisfaction of investigating/arresting officer and the petitioner shall co-operate in the investigation.*

If the arresting officer does not permit the petitioner to join the investigation, the petitioner would appear before the learned Illaqa Magistrate, who would then summon the arresting officer and direct him to join the petitioner in the investigation, in terms of the order of this Court.

Nothing observed hereinabove shall be construed as an expression of opinion by this Court and the trial Court shall decide the same on its own merits, strictly in accordance with law."



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3. Learned State counsel on instructions from ASI Sukhdev Singh, submits that in compliance of order dated 14.08.2024 passed by this Court, the petitioner has joined the investigation and is not required for further custodial interrogation.

4. Keeping in view the statement made by learned State Counsel the order dated 14.08.2024, is made absolute. The petitioner shall abide by the terms and conditions enumerated in Section 438(2) of Cr.P.C.

5. The petition is accordingly disposed of.
