1. The petitioners in the instant petition filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C. are praying for quashing of the order dated 30.05.2024 (Annexure P-9) passed by the learned trial Court vide which bail granted to them in case FIR No.413 dated 31.12.2023 under Sections 341, 323, 325, 307, 149 of the IPC (Section 325 IPC added later on) registered at Police Station City Kapurthala, District Kapurthala was cancelled owing to their non-appearance in the Court.

2. Learned counsel submits that the petitioners had been regularly appearing before the Court concerned and it was only on 30.07.2024 that they could not put in appearance on account of noting down wrong date of hearing. Learned counsel further submits that the petitioners are ready to appear and join proceedings before the learned trial Court. Hence, in the aforementioned facts and circumstances, the petitioners be protected till their appearance before the Court concerned



and the Court be directed that their application, which they would be filing on their surrender, be decided expeditiously.

3. Notice of motion.

4. Mr. Navdeep Singh, Dy. Advocate General, Punjab who is present in Court, accepts notice on behalf of the State.

5. I have heard learned counsel for the parties and perused the relevant material on record.

6. In view of the limited prayer made by learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioners, the petition is disposed of with direction to the petitioners to appear and surrender before the learned trial Court within seven days from today. Till then, no coercive steps shall be taken against them, subject to payment of costs in the sum of ₹10,000/- which shall be deposited by the petitioners with the District Legal Services Authority (DLSA), Kapurthala as well as planting 4 indigenous trees (2 fruit-bearing and 2 shady trees) within the judicial complex at Kapurthala, with the specific area to be identified by the DLSA concerned, within seven days from today which shall be a condition precedent; the DLSA would also ensure the proper maintenance and upkeep of the trees so planted.

7. However, it is made clear that in case the petitioners fail to surrender before the Court concerned within the above stipulated time period, this order shall be of no avail to them, thereafter. In case, on



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appearance and surrender, the petitioners move an application for bail, the learned trial Court shall make earnest efforts to decide the same expeditiously, in accordance with law.
