SUVIR SEHGAL, J. (ORAL)

1. Instant writ petition has been filed under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India for issuance of writ in the nature of certiorari for quashing impugned order dated 18.07.2024, Annexure P-2, passed by respondent No.3, whereby licence of petitioner's firm has been cancelled.

2. At the outset, counsel for the petitioner submits that he has challenged the impugned order, Annexure P-2, by filing an appeal, Annexure P-7, before respondent No.2. He submits that despite filing the appeal on 31.07.2024, it is not being fixed for hearing. By inviting the attention of the Court to the impugned order, Annexure P-2, he submits that the petitioner has been directed to dispose off the stock of fertilizer lying in his shop within a period of 30 days from the passing of the order, Annexure P-2.



3. Advance copy of the petition has been served upon the State counsel. Upon instructions from Gurjit Singh Brar, Joint Director, Agriculture (Inputs) Punjab, State counsel submits that the appeal will be taken up for hearing on 27.08.2024.
4. Be that as it may, since by impugned order, Annexure P-2, petitioner has been asked to dispose off the stock within a period of 30 days, effect of that order shall remain stayed till the time the appeal is decided by respondent No.2.
5. Writ petition is disposed of.
6. It is however made clear that in case the appeal is dismissed, petitioner will dispose off the stock as provided in the relevant rules/regulations.
