1. Instant writ petition has been filed under Articles 226/227 of Constitution of India *inter alia* for issuance of a writ in the nature of mandamus directing respondents No.1 and 2 to re-issue a pass-port to the petitioner, who is a minor.
2. Upon instructions from respondent No.2, Mr. Arvind Seth, counsel for the respondents submits that the pass-port has been issued and dispatched to the petitioner via speed post on 11.10.2024.
3. Counsel for the petitioner submits that he has received telephonic instructions that the fresh pass-port has been received. He submits that in view of this development, the petition has become infructuous.
4. Dismissed as having been rendered infructuous.
