SHEEL NAGU, CHIEF JUSTICE (Oral)

1. The sole grievance of the petitioner, who has completed her MBBS course under the Post-Matric Scholarship Scheme for SC students, is that her original marks sheet/certificates of 10th and 12th classes, certificate of Completion of Internship, Provisional Degree in respect of completion of MBBS course and character certificate etc., have been withheld by respondent No.4 – University on the ground that part of scholarship amount has not been paid to it.

2. It is not disputed that the scholarship amount is paid by the State of Haryana by crediting the same into the account of student/petitioner.



3. Considering the aforesaid, this Court is of the considered view that documents of the petitioner cannot be withheld when the petitioner is not at fault. The documents thus are required to be released.
4. Accordingly, this Court directs respondent No.4 – University, by way of a writ of mandamus, to release original marks sheet/certificates of 10th and 12th classes, certificate of Completion of Internship, Provisional Degree in respect of completion of MBBS course and character certificate, pertaining to the petitioner, expeditiously, preferably by tomorrow, subject to her furnishing written undertaking that as and when part of the scholarship amount is received by her, the same shall be credited in the bank account of respondent No.4 – University.
5. The State of Haryana is further directed, by way of a writ of mandamus, to release the amount of scholarship to the petitioner, subject to completion of all the necessary formalities by respondent No.4 – University.
6. Respondent No.4 – University is at liberty to re-visit this Court, in case the petitioner fails to pay the scholarship amount to it.
7. Petition stands disposed of accordingly.
