1. The petitioner has filed the second petition under Section 438 Cr.P.C. with a prayer to grant anticipatory bail to him in FIR No.274 dated 19.07.2023 registered under Sections 20(B)(ii)(C) of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985, at Police Station Bilaspur, District Gurugram.

2. Status report by way of an affidavit of Assistant Commissioner of Police (Crime), Gurugram has been filed by learned State counsel in Court today and the same is taken on record.

3. As per the record, the petitioner had earlier filed a petition bearing CRM-M-33798-2024 with similar prayer, however, after hearing learned counsel for the petitioner at length, this Court was not inclined to grant the relief to him. Consequently, after arguing at length, the learned counsel for the petitioner had withdrawn the petition. Now, the second petition has been filed without any change of circumstances. Even on the last date of hearing, there

was no representation on behalf of the petitioner and even today, no one has appeared to assist the Court on behalf of the petitioner.

4. I have heard learned counsel for the State and perused the record carefully.

5. It is apparent from the record that after dismissal of the earlier bail petition on 17.07.2024, there is no change of circumstances and the present petition is not maintainable. Consequently, the present petition is ordered to be dismissed.
