1. Mr. Pranav Handa, Advocate puts in appearance on behalf of respondent No.6, by filing his Memorandum of Appearance, and the same is taken on record.
2. The petitioner has filed the present petition under Article 226 of the Constitution of India with a prayer to issue appropriate directions to respondents No.1 to 5 to protect the life and liberty of the present petitioner and his family members by providing adequate security as the respondent No.6 has extended the threats to them to get them killed through contract killers.
3. On the last date of hearing, the Security Committee headed by ADGP, (Security) Punjab was directed to assess the threat perception of the petitioner and was directed to submit a report before the next date of hearing.

4. During the course of arguments, a report of Security Committee in respect of the petitioner was produced before the Court and after perusal, the said report has been returned to learned State counsel. Learned State counsel submits that a detailed discussion has been held with regard to the various aspects of the threat perception to the petitioner and input has been taken from Intelligence Wing and the Local Police. As per the inputs collected from different sources, no specific threat inputs have been found from any terrorist/military/gangsters party operating in the country and as such there is no threat to the present petitioner.
5. In view of the statement made by the learned State counsel, no further orders are required to be passed by this Court and the present petition is accordingly disposed off.
