The instant petition has been instituted under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, 1950 seeking issuance of a writ in the nature of Mandamus directing the respondents to release the payment of all the three bills submitted by the petitioner firm to the respondent No.4-Municipal Committee, Shahabad, alongwith interest @ 18% per annum.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that with regard to the grievance, petitioner-firm has served Legal Notice dated 12.04.2024 (Annexure P-24) to the respondent-authorities but no action has been taken by the respondent-authorities.

Notice of motion.

Mr. Pankaj Mulwani, DAG, Haryana appears and accepts notice on behalf of respondents No.1 to 3.

Mr. Vivek Saini, Advocate appears and accepts notice on behalf of respondents No. 4-Municipal Committee, Shahabad.

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Learned counsel for the petitioner, however, submits that at this juncture, he would be satisfied if respondent No.4-Municipal Committee, Shahabad (M) through its Secretary is directed to consider and decide the Legal Notice dated 12.04.2024 (Annexure P-24) in a time bound manner.

Learned Counsel appearing on behalf of the respondents do not oppose the prayer made by learned counsel for the petitioner.

Accordingly, in view of the above, with the consent of the parties and without commenting anything on the merits of the case, the present petition is disposed of while directing respondent No.4-Municipal Committee, Shahabad (M) through its Secretary to consider and decide the Legal Notice dated 12.04.2024 (Annexure P-24) by passing a reasoned and speaking order after affording an opportunity of hearing to the respective parties within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

Needless to mention that upon considering the said Legal Notice, if any amount is found due and payable to the petitioner, the same shall be disbursed in his favour within a further period of three months.

Petition stands disposed of accordingly.
