CWP- 22028-2024

The petition has been filed, *inter alia*, seeking a writ of



certiorari setting aside the transfer order dated 07.08.2024, Annexure P-1 and subsequent orders dated 23.08.2024 and 27.08.2024, Annexures P-7 and P-8, respectively, whereby the petitioner was transferred from Government College, Naraingarh (Ambala) to Government College, Mangali (Hisar).

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner has been transferred to Government College, Mangali, Hisar, where sanctioned strength of Commerce teachers is three. As per the student enrollment details in the current academic session, only ten students have been admitted; whereas in the Naraingarh College, for the current Session there is a shortage of three Assistant Professors in Commerce. Accordingly, no purpose is being served by transferring him to Government College, Mangali. The petitioner has already submitted a detailed representation dated 15.09.2024, Annexure P-23, to the Principal Secretary, Higher Education Department, mentioning all these facts and seeking a sympathetic consideration. At this stage, the petitioner will be satisfied in case the officer is directed to decide the representation expeditiously.

3. Learned State counsel appearing on behalf of the respondents submits that the pending representation, dated 15.09.2024, will be decided by the respondents expeditiously.

4. In view thereof, without going into the merits of the case, the petition is disposed of with a direction to the first respondent-Principal Secretary, Higher Education Department to consider and decide the pending representation, dated 15.09.2024, by passing a speaking order in accordance with law, within a period of four weeks of receiving a certified copy of this order.



5. In case the order is not passed within the stipulated period, the officer concerned shall pay costs of ₹50,000 to the petitioner.
