1. This order shall decide CRM-M No. 50296-2022 and CRM-M Nos. 4822, 4825 and 4864 of 2018 by the common order and the facts are borrowed from CRM-M No. 50296-2022.

2. This petition has been filed under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure with prayer for issuance of direction to respondents to separate the complaint of the petitioner from FIR No. 50 dated 31.03.2017, registered under Section 420 IPC at Police Station North, Chandigarh and register a separate FIR against the Directors of M/s Foreign Horizon Overseas Consultant Private Limited under Sections 403, 406, 420 and 120-B IPC on the basis of complaint submitted by the petitioner No. 1.

3. Learned Addl. Public Prosecutor for UT Chandigarh submits that during the course of investigation, it was revealed that there are 383 victims which have been duped by the accused on the pretext of sending them abroad and the Investigating Agency is filing separate challan by clubbing 3 cases in view of the provision contained in Section 219 of Cr.P.C. The final report has been filed on 21.03.2023 and charges were framed on 11.04.2023. He further submits that the 33 challans has already been filed and the Investigating Agency is in the process of filing separate challan in other pending cases.

4. In view of the above, the grievance raised by the petitioner in the present petition has been redressed substantially and no further directions are required in the present case.

In view of the specific stand taken by the Investigating Agency before this Court, the Investigating Officer is directed to file separate challan in all the pending cases by following the drill of Section 219 Cr.P.C within a period of six months.
